A RESOLUTION BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILLIAMS, COUNTY OF COCONINO, ARIZONA, DESIGNATING THE ELECTION DATE FOR THE 2024 ELECTION(S), PURPOSE OF ELECTION(S), THE DEADLINE FOR VOTER REGISTRATION, THE PLACE AND LAST DATE FOR CANDIDATES TO FILE NOMINATION PAPERS.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Williams as follows:

Section 1 Designation of Election Dates, Purposes

August 6, 2024, has been set as the time for holding the Primary Election in the City of Williams, Arizona, for the following purposes:

Nominating candidates for Mayor and three (3) City Council Seats, whose names shall appear
on the ballot at the General Election to be held on November 5, 2024. Any candidate receiving a
majority of all the votes cast at the Primary Election will be declared elected without running at the
General Election; and

Section 2 Designating Deadline for Voter Registration

Coconino County registration and voting lists will be used for the municipal election. To be qualified to vote, one must be registered by July 8, 2024 (29 days before the primary election).

Section 3 Designating Date and Place to File Candidate Nomination Forms

Candidates seeking municipal office may obtain nomination papers and other materials that the candidate must complete and may begin filing at City Hall, starting March 9, 2024. Candidates must return their completed nomination petitions along with all other nomination forms by 5:00 p.m. on April 8, 2024, at City Hall for their names to appear on the Primary Election ballot.



Model City Tax Code Article IV - Privilege Taxes



Staff is now asking Council to review and possibly amend the City's tax code by ordinance to raise the Hotel Tax to the maximum rate and include Sec 110-447 moving forward. Staff and Council have previously completed together; the posting of the following to the City's website:

"The Mayor and Council may consider transaction privilege tax rate changes for the Hotels classification and the Additional Tax on Transients classification, not less than sixty (60) days after the posting of this notice on 10/05/2023."

adopted Resolution 1439, declaring as a public record that certain document filed with the City Clerk, entitled "The 2012-2014 Amendments to the Tax Code of the City of Williams" along with Ordinance 1002 adopting "The 2012-2014 Amendments to the Tax Code of the City of Williams" by reference. These actions were completed in preparation to move forward with Sec. 110-447 should the City Council approve.

Staff is asking for the Council to review the City's Hotel tax as well. The tax is currently at four and one-half percent (4.5%). Per State statutes the City can raise this tax by one percent (1%) to five and one-half percent (5.5%). This would be the maximum the City could increase this tax.

Fiscal Impact: By implementing Sec 110-447; based on current collections, the City could collect approximately \$2.5 million annually.

Should City Council also approve the increase to the current Hotel Tax by one percent (1%) to the maximum five and one-half percent (5.5%), it could increase collections by approximately \$550,000 annually.



Together these taxes could bring in a total of approximately \$3 million additional taxes annually. Funds from the Transiet tax (sec. 110-447) are all General Fund (operating) monies, considered unrestricted, therefore they can be used for general operations, infrastructure, debt service, special projects, water/sewer, streets/roads, electric, etc. With Council approval at this meeting, these tax changes would be effective April 1, 2024.

Recommendation:

- 1] Approve the implementation of the Transient Lodging Tax (Sec.110-447) at the rate of five and one-half percent (5.5%)
- Approve the increase to the Hotel Tax to the maximum rate of five and onehalf percent (5.5%).

ORDINANCE NO. 1003

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WILLIAMS, ARIZONA, AMENDING THE CITY TAX CODE BY INCREASING THE HOTEL TAX RATE TO FIVE AND ONE-HALF PERCENT (5.5%) AND ADOPTING A LOCAL TRANSIENT LODGING TAX BY WITHDRAWING MODEL OPTION #6; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND DESIGNATING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILLIAMS, ARIZONA:

<u>Section 1:</u> Section 110-444, Hotels, of the Tax Code of the City of Williams is amended to a rate of five and one-half percent (5.5%).

Section 2: Model Option #6 of the Model City Tax Code is hereby withdrawn, and the City Transient Lodging Tax is established at a rate of five and one-half percent (5.5%) under Section 110-447 of the Tax Code of the City of Williams.

Section 3: That certain document known as "The 2024 Transient Lodging Tax Amendment to the Tax Code of the City of Williams", three copies of which are on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Williams, Arizona, which document was made a public record by Resolution No1441 of the City of Williams, Arizona, is hereby referred to, adopted and made a part hereof as if fully set out in this ordinance.

Section 4: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance or any part of these amendments to the tax code adopted herein by reference is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

Section 5: The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this ordinance upon adoption as required by A.R.S. 9-812 and A.R.S. 9-813.

Section 6: The provisions of this ordinance shall become effective on and after April 1, 2024.

Section I. The Tax Code of the City of Williams Section 110-444 is amended as follows, with an effective date of April 1, 2024.

Sec. 110-444. Hotels.

The tax rate shall be at an amount equal to four and one half percent (4.5%) FIVE AND ONE-HALF PERCENT (5.5%) of the gross income from the business activity upon every person engaging or continuing in the business of operating a hotel charging for lodging and/or lodging space furnished to any:

- (a) Transient PERSON.
- (b) Exclusions. The tax imposed by this Section shall not include:
 - Income derived from incarcerating or detaining prisoners who are under the jurisdiction of the United States, this State or any other state or a political subdivision of this State or of any other state in a privately operated prison, jail or detention facility.
 - (2) Gross proceeds of sales or gross income that is properly included in another business activity under this Article and that is taxable to the person engaged in that business activity, but the gross proceeds of sales or gross income to be deducted shall not exceed the consideration paid to the person conducting the activity.
 - (3) Gross proceeds of sales or gross income from transactions or activities that are not limited to transients and that would not be taxable if engaged in by a person not subject to tax under this Article.
 - (4) Gross proceeds of sales or gross income from transactions or activities that are not limited to transients and that would not be taxable if engaged in by a person subject to taxation under Section 110-410 or Section 110-475 due to an exclusion, exemption or deduction.
 - (5) Gross proceeds of sales or gross income from commissions received from a person providing services or property to the customers of the hotel. However, such commissions may be subject to tax under Section 110-445 or Section 110-450 as rental, leasing or licensing for use of real or tangible personal property.
 - (6) Income from providing telephone, fax or internet services to customers at an additional charge, that is separately stated to the customer and is separately maintained in the hotel's books and records. However, such gross proceeds of sales or gross income may be subject to tax under Section 110-470 as telecommunication services.

Section II. The Tax Code of the City of Williams Section 110-447 is amended as follows, with an effective date of April 1, 2024.

Sec. 110-447. (Reserved)RENTAL, LEASING, AND LICENSING FOR USE OF REAL PROPERTY: ADDITIONAL TAX UPON TRANSIENT LODGING.

The 2022 Use Tax Amendment to the Tax Code of the City of Williams

IN ADDITION TO THE TAXES LEVIED AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 110-444, THERE IS HEREBY LEVIED AND SHALL BE COLLECTED AN ADDITIONAL TAX IN AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO FIVE AND ONE-HALF PERCENT (5.5%) OF THE GROSS INCOME FROM THE BUSINESS ACTIVITY OF ANY HOTEL ENGAGING OR CONTINUING WITHIN THE CITY IN THE BUSINESS OF CHARGING FOR LODGING AND/OR LODGING SPACE FURNISHED TO ANY TRANSIENT.
