- Chris Sadler, a local, wants the council to put roads that need repair onto the next agenda for discussion.
- The mayor explained that the city does plan its road work during budget time.
- Mr. Sadler requested again to address the council to vote on putting it on the agenda for discussion. He mentioned Rodeo Rd and Airport Rd; he sees roads he feels do not need repair and money going into them, like over at the golf course. He brought up a \$25,000.00 mower and stuff; some roads need to be fixed that hasn't been fixed in over 40 years, and he thinks the money can be better spent. He doesn't trust that it will be handled right because he placed a records request over 30 days ago, and the buck keeps getting passed, and no one has answered him. The City Clerk informed him that the FOIA request is with the Ombudsman's office, and she is awaiting his direction.
- Again, he asked about putting a discussion regarding roads on the next agenda, and the mayor will think about it, but it makes no sense to put something on the agenda when there is nothing for us to decide on. The mayor pointed out the work that is beginning on Edison right now. He went on to explain the progression of the work, noting that it is one of the major road projects this year. We can provide a list of the past projects completed. The mayor went on to speak of other road projects that have been completed and how money is budgeted and kept separate for each of the departments, i.e., money spent on the golf course is revenue from the golf course.
